Tick Exposure—Moderate/High

MEDICATION	PARASITE PROTECTION
Interceptor	Heartworms Roundworms, Hookworms
Frontline	Fleas Ticks

Deworming

EXPOSURE RISK	RECOMMENDATION
Kittens	Every 2 weeks from 2 to 16 weeks of age. Extended if doses missed.
Nursing Mothers	Treat with kittens.
Adults	Deworm monthly with heartworm prevention medications.
Newly Acquired Cats	Deworm at least three times and then after as needed.

FELINE AGE & RISK-BASED WELLNESS TESTING

INTESTINAL PARASITE TESTING

Exposure Risk	Recommendation
Low	Yearly
Moderate	Every 6 months
High or parasites previously found	Every 3 months

TEST	AGE	RECOMMENDATION
Junior profile	3 to 9 years	Every 2 years
Junior profile	9 to 10 years	Every year
Senior Profile	>10 years	Every year
Senior profile	>14 years	Every 6 months

Junior Profile
Complete blood count
Screens red cells, white cells, platelets

Minichem panel & urine specific gravity
Screens liver, kidneys, blood sugar, blood proteins, potassium

Senior Profile
Complete blood count
Screens red cells, white cells, platelets

Full chem panel & urinalysis

Screens liver, kidneys, blood sugar, blood proteins, cholesterol, electrolytes, calcium, phosphorus, thyroid, pancreas, and urinary tract disorders
